COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

Dear Camp LiveGirl Parents and Guardians,

We can't wait to start Camp LiveGirl! Before camp starts, I wanted to share some important COVID-19 safety protocols.

Camp LiveGirl will continue to adhere to all [CDC](#) and [OEC](#) guidelines for COVID safety and prevention related to schools and youth camps.

Before arriving at camp each day, families must complete the [CDC Coronavirus Self-Checker](#) for each child attending. (Please note, even if your child is vaccinated, we ask that you complete the self-check.) If the self-check recommends testing, please contact COVID@golivegirl.org immediately so that we may prepare for contact tracing should you receive a positive test result. Your child's temperature will be checked each morning upon arrival at Camp LiveGirl. If her temperature is 100 or above, she will be sent home with parents responsible for transportation.

In the event of a positive test, the family must notify COVID@golivegirl.org immediately. LiveGirl will then conduct contact tracing to determine anyone who may be considered a close contact and send an email to families who need to quarantine. All close contacts will be asked to quarantine for seven days from the date of last contact with a negative PCR test taken on or after the 5th day of potential exposure. Quarantine is not required if your child is vaccinated. Please fill out our COVID Questionnaire [HERE](#) ASAP if you have not already. We will not share the names of or health information about any campers.

In the event that your unvaccinated daughter is contact traced and requires quarantine, she will be able to participate in a remote session of Camp LiveGirl's "Brave Leaders" Academy from 9am-12pm. Unfortunately, it is not possible to participate in designLab/afternoon activities remotely. We will therefore refund \$30 per afternoon of quarantine. Any additional refunds will be issued on a case-by-case basis.

All faculty, staff, and counselors will wear a mask and practice physical distancing at all times indoors (except while seated at partitioned tables during lunch) regardless of vaccination status.

Faculty, staff, counselors, and student-participants may remove their masks while outside. However, masks will be required outside during activities involving close contact with unvaccinated individuals and in large group settings. (Please note, if you prefer to have your child masked at all times, even when outdoors and distanced, they may do so.)

Camp LiveGirl is doing everything possible to make camp, safe, fun, and memorable for all our participants. Thank you for your kindness as we continue to navigate these unusual times. If you have any questions regarding our COVID-19 safety protocols please do not hesitate to contact me.

3. Teams will do an application with a "get up and move" activity where they will take part in confidence-boosting games.



DESIGNLAB OVERVIEW



Week 1: Create

In the designLab we can become inventors, carpenters, engineers and designers. This class is designed to allow our youngest students to tinker with tools and gadgets in order to understand the foundation of basic woodworking. In this safe and encouraging environment, students will get a safety overview and hands on experience building with wood. Each student will create a plan, build and assemble their projects, and learn about simple machines. Materials are provided for this one week, afternoon course.

Week 2: Virtual Reality

This exploration of virtual reality is led by St. Luke's designLab teacher Kimberly Gerardi. Campers will learn how to draw and render for virtual reality. We will discover that our sketches and illustrations can become fantastic virtual environments. For those who love to draw and color, and for those who love to use the computer to create works of art, there is something for everyone in this afternoon activity. Campers can unlock the secrets to creating virtual reality and be thoroughly amazed at how their worlds can captivate others. Everyone can easily turn their drawings and stories into virtual destinations.

Week 3: Coding

Girls Who Code is an International non profit organization working to close the gender gap in the technology field. This program is led by St. Luke's teacher Kimberly Gerardi and we will learn how to code through creative projects such as app invention, quizzes and puzzles. Each lesson has a workflow that allows students to zoom in on aspects of the projects that are meaningful to them. Students can collaborate or work independently on coding projects. Lessons range from one hour projects to sophisticated applications, so there really is something for everyone regardless of experience. Beyond our camp experience, Girls Who Code offers students the opportunity to stay connected with the network of girls and women as they grow in STEM and computer science. All girls, and those who identify as girls are welcome in grades 4-8. We can accommodate multiple skill levels in one camp.





WEEK 3

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are so happy to be in person for camp this summer and to partner with Camp LiveGirl at the St. Luke's designLab. I wanted to reach out to make sure you are aware that the camp for the week of July 19th will include the need for computers in the afternoon. Campers will use the platform Girls Who Code HQ and will need to create a login for this class. If you do not have a computer we will make every effort to provide a loaner computer for the week. We have a limited amount of loaners so please reach out to us (camp@golivegirl.org) if you need a computer for camp.

Before you start camp please follow the steps below at home. If you cannot do this at home, please reach out to us and we will help get your child registered.

Here are the steps to get registered for our class in the girls who code platform.

1. You will go to hq.girlswhocode.com to sign up. Once you click sign up it will ask your country which is the United States. You will need to enter a parent email at the top of the next screen.
2. Then directly under your parent email create YOUR USER NAME AND PASSWORD. This is the camper's username and password NOT your parent's username and password to their email.
3. They will ask you for a class code which is CT36424. If you are in grade 4 your code is CT36423.
4. Once you sign up for that class you will be asked if it looks familiar. Our class is at St. Luke's School and my name is Kimberly Gerardi.


That is all you need to do!

They ask demographic information after you sign up so that they can continue to reach more students who have all kinds of different ethnicities and socio-economic backgrounds.

Bestselling Author



Miss Stamford USA 2021



Renee Reyes uses her platform as a way to spread awareness about alopecia and to change today's beauty standards for the better.

Reyes was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, but she currently lives in Stamford, Connecticut. Inspired by her mother's past as a beauty pageant contestant, Reyes entered Miss Teen Connecticut 2015, where she was a semi-finalist. Then, in 2018, she started to notice the first signs of her alopecia.

She hopes to win Miss USA and Miss Universe, which would give her an even grander platform to spread alopecia awareness. Reyes is looking to establish her own non-profit volunteer organization for alopecia awareness.

As a representative of her community, Reyes is expected to participate in community service and outreach. Currently, she is organizing a diaper drive to collect supplies for struggling families in Connecticut. She says her new title gives her a responsibility to give back and speak out.

Reyes is also studying horticulture at the New York Botanical Garden. As a child, her fascination with dinosaurs and paleontology blossomed into a passion for botany. The current owner of over 200 plants, she works in interior horticulture, but she plans to pursue research going forward.

On the first day of each week, counselors will be outside to greet parents and campers.

CHECK-IN/DISMISSAL

Check-in begins at 8:45am daily. Campers should arrive no later than 8:55 am.

Camp will begin promptly at 9am and will be dismissed at 4pm.

Parents/guardians are responsible for their child upon dismissal.

WHAT TO WEAR/BRING


